PROFILES OF SCHOLARS IN THE DIASPORA



Dr. Murid **Partaw**

Dr. Murid Partaw obtained in BA in International Studies and MA in Political Science. He received his PhD from the School of Interdisciplinary Global Studies (SIGS) at University of South Florida.

His research interests lie at the intersection of Comparative Politics and IR, specializing in security studies, democratization, legitimization, and state-building and currently teaches at University of Tampa as a Political Science Senior Lecturer.

Dr. Partaw research has appeared in the ranked journals of Political Science and IR such as Journal of Political Science and Public Affairs, Democracy and Security, The British Journal of Middle Eastern Studies, Studies in Conflict and Terrorism, and Small Wars and Insurgencies. In addition, he has taught courses in International Security, IR, Comparative Politics, Conflict in the World, Politics of the Middle East, Globalization, including American Government at University of South Florida and University of Tampa. Before joining the academia, Dr. Partaw served as Afghanistan Senior National Representative to the United States Central Command (USCENTCOM), where he worked with a broad coalition of 60 nations in the "War against Terror."

Dr. Partaw currently serves as a fellow at the Center for Eastern and Central European Russian and Eurasian Studies (CECERES) at Troy University.



Dr. Naser Lessani

Dr. Naser Lessani is a thirdyear PhD student in Geographic Information Science (GIScience) at The Pennsylvania State University, USA. He holds an MSc in GIS from Central South University.

China. His research focuses on geospatial big data analytics, spatial modeling, and the integration of generative AI in GIS tool.

Currently, Naser works as a Research Assistant alongside his PhD studies and was recently awarded the William and Mary Easterling Outstanding Graduate Research Assistant Award by Penn State's College of Earth and Mineral Sciences, Department of Geography. Over the past three years, he has collaborated with research teams from different institutions including Harvard Medical School, the University of Southern California, the Arnold School of Public Health at the University of South Carolina, Temple University, and the Department of Public Health at Jinan University in China. He also serves as the Student Director of the Cyberinfrastructure Specialty Group within the American Association of Geographers. Additionally, he is a reviewer for several international journals, including the International Journal of Geographical Information Science. He has published 15 research articles as both first author and coauthor, with his work covering topics such as spatial modeling, human mobility, sexually transmitted infectious diseases, and Generative AI in the realm of GIS.



Dr. Abbas Ali Husseini

Dr Abbas Ali Husseini is an accomplished researcher specializing in molecular epidemiology, biotechnology, and biomedical sciences. With a PhD in

Biotechnology from Ankara University, his research focuses on the genetic and environmental determinants of cancer susceptibility, particularly within the Turkish population. His work spans molecular diagnostics, bioinformatics, and the development of innovative biosensors and genetic screening tools for disease detection.

Dr. Husseini has led multiple TÜBİTAK and institutional research projects, investigating GST gene polymorphisms, cancer biomarker discovery, and machine learning applications in oncology. He has published extensively in peer-reviewed journals on topics ranging from viral epidemiology to advanced diagnostic methodologies.

His expertise in bio-statistics, molecular genetics, and translational me-dicine positions him at the forefront of personalized cancer research, striving to bridge the gap between genetic predisposition and clinical outcomes.

Institutional Continuity and Incremental Change: Models of Economic Development in Post-Intervention Societies

Speaker: Dr. Lutfi Rahimi, Non-Resident Research Fellow at ARI.

Discussant: Prof. Michael Cox, Founding Director of International Relations at the London School of Economics (LSE), UK.

The economic transition in Afghanistan in 2001 was marked by institutional discontinuity. Afghanistan adopted a market-led, enabler-state framework, radically departing from the past, heavily influenced by neoliberal ideology and donor-driven aspirations. This shift ignored deeply ingrained public expectations of state economic roles, the absence of pre-existing market mechanisms, and the strong legacy of dirigisme. The imposed model disrupted and antagonised existing structures without fostering a coherent economic governance system. This lecture explores how these factors, compounded by corruption, insecurity, and fragility, led to suboptimal economic performance and policy failures. Watch the full lecture here.

Deforestation, Biodiversity Loss and Restoration Challenges in Afghanistan

Speaker: Mujib Rahman Ahmadzai, Lecturer, Faculty of Environment, Kabul University. Discussant: Dr. Maksim Kulikov, Research Fellow, UCA's Mountain Societies Research Institute.

Afghanistan's forests and biodiversity face severe threats from deforestation caused by fuelwood collection, agricultural expansion, illegal logging, and conflict. Climate-related factors, such as droughts and fires, exacerbate these issues, leading to ecological degradation that includes habitat loss, soil erosion, and disrupted water cycles. This presentation explores the causes and consequences of deforestation and biodiversity loss, emphasising socio-economic impacts on forestdependent communities. It highlights sustainable restoration strategies, such as agroforestry, communitygovernance. led reforestation, and improved The presentation concludes with actionable recommendations to ensure the long-term health and resilience of Afghanistan's ecosystems.


